of people has been sick lately with the blue  
15 below to night at 9<sup>30</sup>

Fri 3 35 below this morning clear and cold all day  
A few trucks passing to Dawson Creek with  
grain and hay

Sat 4 39 below this morning cold all wind from  
East drove over with Fred and got the mail  
Douglas Birby arrived for a visit cold  
and clear to night 26 below at 10 to night

Sun 5 42 below this cold all day  
Fred went over to Birby's to cut fire wood

Mon 6 40 below cold all day Duncan  
brought a load of fire wood this evening  
John arrived from Saklunna Post

Tue 7 40 below cold all day and very little  
doing around a few trucks running  
with wheat to Dawson Creek  
35 below to night
