Wed 4 Weather fine had got the mail

west wind

Fri 6 Had blowing a strong west wind but

had went over to Smiths for Radio

Mon 9 Blowing a cold N.W. wind with snow this
morning and snowed about 2 inches
last night, clear and cold to night

Tue 10 A hard frost last night, but fine and mild
towards noon, cold and clear to night

Wed 11 Blowing zero this morning I drove over
and got the mail about 10 AM. Trucks passed
with bright they are carrying west of here

Thu 12 Blowing a cold wind had and this morning
left by the mail truck they are going to
Wahimwa Lake in Alta to be married
I drove them over to town this morning
