we cut about 12 loads of hay
and put up about 100 calves
the mail arrived

Sunday 5

Mail left this morning
started to Rain in afternoon
and continued all day

Saturday 10

Came in from Hay Camp
put up 22 loads fine weather
H. Badenhead arrived from P. H. H.
with his motor

Saturday 19

Finished 39 loads of hay
