- June 1 Frank Anderson returning servant started for Peace River heading this morning, with the Returns for 01.1898
- 2 Busy taking inventory,
- 3 Busy taking inventory.
- 4 Sunday.
- 5 Indians bothering for debt and making themselves generally awkward. Pierre & Joe cutting potatoes
- 6 Busy taking inventory. Pierre & Joe planting potatoes
- 7 Pierre and Joe planting potatoes
- 8 Pierre and Joe fencing potato patch. The Beaver Indians have burnt up the fence for firewood
- 9 Pierre and Joe fencing finished. They started up the River to day to get out bark for shore and logs for shingles
- 10 Raining to Day. Fritz Ahern and party arrived from Hudson Hope at
- 11 Sunday Raining hard to day.
- 12 Pierre and Joe arrived from up the River this evening.
- 13 Quiet today
- 14 Pierre and Joe putting on bark on Roof.
- 15 Pierre and Joe at odd jobs
- 16 Quiet and not much done, all Greenston arrived.
- 17 Fine weather & quiet
- 18 Sunday.
- 19 Mr Greenston started for Peace River today. The River very high
- 20 Looking out for Indians but none arrived
- 21 Day started for arrival of Commissioner of Indian Affairs
- 22 No Indians & no Commissioner. Expectant
- 23 Mr Greenston arrived from Peace River and reported his Cache broken into and quite bot mising.
