Balam of amount of gunpowder digging the next house
in afternoon.

TUESDAY 9

(282-88)

1 Breakfast day finished taking up potatoes
in all about 110 Bushels
to take the Boat up to the Hope
Balam taking
up his potatoes

FRIDAY 12

(285-80)

Rain this morning self opening up goods
still very cloudy and water like lead water

WEDNESDAY 10

(283-83)

A fine warm day Balam putting up supplies for
Hudsons Hope Boat
traded up the Boat
this evening
3 Police arrived from Ft. Buchanan
with Horses on their way to S.S. Lake
John Indians arrived
Olechie & Wanklawy arrived

SATURDAY 13

(286-79)

The Police left this morning for S.S. Lake
with their Horses. One of the Indian Boatmen
arrived for provisions he reports the death
of Mr. E. G. Probert of S.S. Lake the manager of the
French Company. Self busy in store Sampson of name
Thomas arrived
Secretary 14 (287-78)
Self out looking at the Hoop found no signs
of game
