Tuesday 28

Clear and cold I drove up and got the mail and I also went to the H/B and had dinner. The roads fairly good as a lot of snow fell last night. The H/B getting ready to send freight to the Siskina Post.

Wednesday 29

Cold and stormy, heavy a strong North Wind. I was busy at work. Willie went for the mail but it did not get in. Sewell & 2 others came and hauled up his boat, the water going down a little some ice going down.

Thursday 30

Cold and stormy all day wind blowing from North East. With snow I drove up to get the mail but mail not on. I then drove over to the H/B. H. McLeod was loading up freight for Siskina & Ft Nelson Post. They left after dinner. I then went over to Police Barracks where Mr. Agian & I had a case. Underwood & J. Brown showing a very strong gale of wind from N.E. North to West and very cold.
