FRIDAY, 18

(362-13)

SATURDAY, 19

(363-12)

Left to north went up to the island to see the horses  
and got some wood for shelter in Taylor's barrow  
Started to snow in the afternoon. Sawmen arrived  
cleared up towards evening.

To Bay brought a few more  
from the north
